THE 2000 SEASON

The loss of Tim Munton to Derbyshire Scorpions and retirement of Gladstone Small is a blow for Warwickshire Bears' one-day hopes after the disappointment of relegation on the last day of last season.

The gap in the bowling attack is, however, off-set by the expected return to fitness of South African paceman Allan Donald to aid the excellent Ed Giddins and the spin of Ashley Giles.

A great deal will depend on the batting of Nick Knight, who has just signed a new four-year contract at Edgbaston, and the belligerent middle-order of Dominic Ostler, Dougie Brown and Neil Smith.

The Bears face a tough challenge to emulate their all-conquering form of the early 1990s but will begin their push for promotion to Division One against Hampshire Hawks at Southampton on May 1.

One-to-watch: After committing his future to Warwickshire, Nick Knight should be able to settle down and concentrate on his batting. His free-scoring style at the top of the order can destroy even the most potent of attacks.

THE 2000 SEASON

The prospect of Shane Warne strolling up to the wicket in Hampshire Hawks colours is a mouth-watering one for the Northlands Road faithful. And the magical leg-spinner's presence makes the Hawks a good tip to bounce straight back to Division One at the first attempt.

The club were rock-bottom last year, but Warne's recruitment - along with that of left-arm seamer Alan Mullally gives The Hawks a fearsome two-pronged bowling attack. Mullally missed out on an England contract, but his addition to the Hawks' bowling attack is very significant.

Jimmy Cook comes in as the new coach, and he will be keen to encourage batting support for skipper Robin Smith, who traditionally shoulders most responsibility at the crease.

One-to-watch: Derek Kenway smashed almost 1,000 runs last season, and the 23-year-old could emerge as valuable support for Smith. The 21-year-old is also a useful medium-pace bowler and occasional wicket-keeper.

THE 2000 SEASON

After a disastrous season last year, Essex Eagles will be looking to bounce straight back into the National League top flight after relegation last term.

The loss of Nasser Hussain through England duty will be a blow but the Eagles have the quality to do well without him.

A great deal will rest on prolific Australian batsman Stuart Law and the experienced bowling attack of Mark Illott, Ashley Cowan and Peter Such.

Ronnie Irani has been handed the captaincy in Hussain's absence and his performances, as player and captain, will be crucial to The Eagle's chances.

Irani's first test in the National League comes against Middlesex Crusaders at Chelmsford on April 30 and if they start their league campaign well, a confident Eagles side will provide formidable opposition for anyone.

THE 2000 SEASON

A huge upheaval in the playing staff at Derbyshire Scorpions means the midlanders are something of an unknown quantity this season.

The batting looks to have been strengthened by the acquisition of Rob Bailey from Northamptonshire Steelbacks and the excellent Michael Di Venuto, who replaces the hugely disappointing Michael Slater as overseas player.

Tim Munton has arrived from Warwickshire Bears to provide economical seam bowling but is balanced by the loss of Phil DeFreitas to Leicestershire Foxes and the lack of penetration in their attack does not augur well for an improvement on last season's 8th place in League Division Two.

HOW IT WORKS: The Norwich Union National League operates on a three-up, three-down basis with the top three finishers in Division Two replacing the bottom three of Division One.

Four points are awarded for a win, while teams will take two points each if matches are tied or the weather intervenes before the required number of overs have been completed and there is no result.

Revised playing hours come into effect this season with matches starting at 1pm and ending at 7.10pm with 45 overs per side, although all fixtures will begin 30 minutes earlier in September. Floodlit games will start at 4.10pm. The 'free-hit' rule for no balls will apply to front-foot no balls only this season. A batsman cannot be dismissed from the bowler's next delivery after such an infringement.

This season's competition features the biggest number of day-night matches yet staged in this country - 26 - with 16 out of the 18 counties hosting floodlit cricket.
