Trophy glory on horizon for last eight

here will be a new name on the Cheltenham & Gloucester Trophy this year – and eight counties are still harbouring dreams of silverware and a day out at Lord's.

Holders Gloucestershire are out of this year's competition following their fourth-round defeat against Durham, who themselves remain in with a chance of being crowned the new kings of one-day cricket.

But Martyn Moxon's charges know a repeat performance will be needed to keep them in the tournament as they now face a daunting trip to Blackpool to take on Lancashire.

In fact, there will be no easy ties as the remaining teams reach the business end of the competition.

The pick of the quarter-final action looks to be the showdown between Worcestershire and Leicestershire at New Road, with both sides in impressive one-day form this season.

Andy Bichel, Graeme Hick and Vikram Solanki all have the ability to swing the game in the home side's favour but Leicestershire will call on Pakistan star Shahid Afridi to produce the fireworks he is known for in the international one-day game.

Yorkshire, who produced an excellent fightback to overcome Surrey at Headingley in the fourth round, will face Warwickshire at the same ground in a tie certain to set the pulses racing.

The White Rose county have a battery of England fast bowlers at their disposal with which to shake up the visitors, but they also know that Warwickshire have held the Indian sign over them in recent years.

Kent and Somerset complete the guarter-final line-up and one man is certain to take centre stage at Canterbury's St Lawrence Ground.

England opener Marcus Trescothick struck a pulsating 121 off 83 balls as Somerset romped to a seven-wicket win over Glamorgan in the last round, and he will again be the man to watch.

Fourth Round Review

Champions suffer Trophy exit

efending champions Gloucestershire saw their hopes of retaining the Cheltenham & Gloucester Trophy disappear at the fourth round stage as they lost by three runs to Durham at Bristol.

Mark Alleyne's side looked set to overhaul the visitors' 232 all out when they reached 179 for three with 10 overs remaining, but three wickets from Durham youngster Graeme Bridge saw them lose their way.

Yorkshire also appeared to be on their way out of the competition when Surrey reached 131 for two after 25 overs at Headingley, but Chris Silverwood brought the hosts back into contention with three for 44.

Surrey's eventual 243 still seemed to be out of Yorkshire's reach especially at 84 for four – but a superb unbroken stand of 160 between Gary Fellows and Craig White took David Byas' side through.

England opener Marcus Trescothick smashed a pulsating 121 off just 83 balls at Taunton as Somerset overhauled Glamorgan's 269 for six with more than eight overs to spare.

Trescothick and Peter Bowler put on 143 for the first wicket before Jamie Cox added 63 not out to complete the job. Herefordshire's chances of pulling off another upset were looking promising when Ravi Nagra, who went on to make 105, led the minor county to 179 for four against Worcestershire at New Road.

But the tail collapsed to 210 all out and Graeme Hick, as in the third round against Hertfordshire, took the opportunity to compile a century to see the hosts home with nearly 13 overs remaining.


Warwickshire suffered something of a scare at Edgbaston as they slumped to 93 for five while chasing Essex's disappointing 160 all out.

But Dougie Brown (52 not out) and Trevor Penney (29 not out) calmly steered the home side past the winning post.

Kent had fewer problems as they eased their way past a faltering Northamptonshire side that had paceman Paul Taylor to thank for avoiding a total humiliation at Canterbury.

Taylor's 57 helped the visitors recover from 92 for seven to 200 all out, but it was not enough to prevent a six-wicket win by the home side.

It was similarly plain sailing for Leicestershire as they dismissed Nottinghamshire, whose one-day form completely deserted them, for just 176 at Trent Bridge.

Shahid Afridi took two wickets and scored 23 on his Leicestershire debut and captain Vince Wells stroked 54 not out to end the hosts' interest in the competition.

At Old Trafford, Lancashire eased their way into the quarter-finals with a comfortable seven-wicket win over Sussex, who were bundled out for 151.

All-rounder Andrew Flintoff made it easy for the hosts with an unbeaten 65 from 82 balls as Lancashire cruised home with nearly 15 overs left.

SOMERSET captain Jamie Cox reckons his side are capable of going all the way in the Cheltenham & Gloucester Trophy this season.

Kent cruised to a six-wicket victory over a sorry

Northamptonshire side while Glamorgan suffered the hammer blows of Marcus Trescothick's bat in the last round.

And Cox says the England opener will once again be a vital factor for his side.

"He'll be a key player in every side he's in for the rest of his career," he enthused.

"And he's a fantastic player for our side. We're going OK at the moment although we've dropped a few games we shouldn't have this season.

"It's too early to start talking about silverware but we've certainly got a side capable of winning this competition."

Somerset must first overcome Kent before they can allow themselves to dream of a return trip to Lord's, and they will face a tough test at the St Lawrence Ground.

Kent captain Matthew Fleming said: "We've already beaten Somerset once this season and I'm sure they'll be talking about us as much as we'll be talking about them.

"It would be nice to go to Lord's this year but we're still two games away from that. We're having a good season and it would be lovely to win."

LANCASHIRE coach Bobby Simpson says his side are confident of success in this season's Cheltenham & Gloucester Trophy.

Simpson's men take on Durham with revenge in the air after Lancashire lost out to Martyn Moxon's side in the one-day league in May.

And the Aussie coach reckons the time is right for the Red Rose county to get their own back.

"We're going to approach the game in a very aggressive, very confident manner," he said.

"I think we've turned the corner now, we're out of the maze in terms of the one-day game. We've started to play very well and we're obviously growing in confidence. "And once you get on a run in this competition, you fancy you can go all the way."

A Robbie Williams concert at Old Trafford means the two sides will meet at Blackpool Cricket Club, and Simpson is looking forward to his trip to the seaside.

He added: "There'll be a good crowd up there who'll provide some fantastic support. It should be packed out."

Durham coach Moxon said: "We'll go to Blackpool with confidence having beaten Gloucestershire in the last round. "But we won't be over-confident as we know Lancashire are one of the best teams in the country and their record in one-

day cricket is very good, so we'll have to play at our best. "We've beaten them twice already this year but that won't have too much bearing on the outcome of this one."

THE DUCKWORTH/LEWIS SYSTEM

All Cheltenham & Gloucester Trophy matches have a reserve day, but if play is still lost to the weather the Duckworth Lewis system can be used to reset targets. The system is based on what percentage of its resources (overs and wickets) a team have left.

With 50 overs left and 10 wickets remaining, a team has 100 per cent of its resources left. The table shows the percentage of resources at other stages in the innings.

The procedure for working out targets is as follows:

1) For each innings: Use the table to calculate the resource percentage lost by the interruption and therefore calculate the resource percentage still available. 2) If team 2 have less resources available than team 1, calculate the ratio of the resources available to both teams. Team 2's revised target is obtained by scaling down team 1's score by this ratio.

3) If team 2 have more resources available than team 1, calculate the amount by which team 2's resources exceeds team 1's. Work this out as a percentage of 225 (the average 50-over score in ECB matches and one-day internationals). This gives the extra runs to add to team 1's score to give team 2's target.

For the first 15 overs a minimum of seven fielders plus the bowler and wicket-keeper must be inside the fielding circle as the ball is bowled. For the rest of the innings a minimum of four fielders plus the bowler and wicket-keeper must be inside the circle. The restrictions are lifted earlier when the number of overs is reduced.
In the event of a tie, the team losing fewer wickets will win. If the sides are still level, the higher score after 15 overs will win.
In rounds one and two, run rate may be used to set a revised target after a suspension of play. From round three onwards, the Duckworth Lewis system will be used.
