## Hereford triumph sets up local derby

**H**erefordshire fly the flag for the minor counties as the Cheltenham & Gloucester Trophy reaches the fourth round.

They became only the 11th team in the history of the competition to dispose of first-class opposition when they beat Middlesex by three wickets at Kingsland in an absorbing contest.

Harshad Patel, Nathan Round and Ismail Dawood all made crucial contributions with the bat to ensure a superb victory and Herefordshire now aim to upset Worcestershire at New Road as the competition begins to hot up. Graeme Hick's side thrashed Hertfordshire in the last round but will not be resting on their laurels in a game they will be desperate to win to keep their hopes of silverware alive.

Gloucestershire, winners of the competition for the last two years, will aim to stay on course for a third successive victory when they host Durham at Bristol.

There is an intriguing contest taking place at Edgbaston as Warwickshire, runners-up in 2000, face Essex.

The visitors will look to skipper Ronnie Irani and Australian ace Stuart Law to produce the stunning one-day form they are capable of in a game that is a re-run of the 1997 final when Essex won by nine wickets.

Another mouth-watering encounter takes place at Headingley as Yorkshire face Surrey in a game full of international stars. Whichever county emerges from this real clash of the titans is sure to become one of the favourites to progress all the way to the final.

Other games see Somerset, beaten finalists in 1999, against Glamorgan at Taunton while Kent play host to Northamptonshire at Canterbury.

Lancashire, who have won the competition on seven occasions - more than any other county - face Sussex at Old Trafford and Nottinghamshire will look to Greg Blewett, Darren Bicknell and Usman Afzaal to maintain their brilliant form with the bat against Leicestershire at Trent Bridge.

# All-round effort sees Hereford home

**H**erefordshire stole the headlines after round three of the Cheltenham & Gloucester Trophy as they claimed a place in the last 16 with a stunning win over Middlesex.

The minor county defied the odds with a rousing performance at Luctonians Cricket Club that left the first-class outfit shell-shocked.

Angus Fraser's side looked to have put the tie beyond doubt after Owais Shah (41), David Nash (58), Robin Weston (47) and Michael Roseberry (46) helped them post a total of 278.

But the part-timers refused to throw in the towel and set about their task with relish as Nathan Round (66) and Harshad Patel (68) put on 129 for the first wicket.

Former Glamorgan wicketkeeper Ismail Dawood then joined in the fun with a lightning 34 before Nicholas Davies' unbeaten 27-ball 39 saw them home with just one delivery to spare.

Dawood's former county joined them in round four after a nail-biting three-wicket win over Derbyshire.

The Welshmen looked to be struggling in reply to Derbyshire's 195 as they slumped from 75-1 to 164-7 but Alex Wharf and Michael Powell held firm to ensure progress.

In the only other all first-class tie Durham cruised past Hampshire courtesy of a superb century from 18-year-old Nicky Peng at Chester-le-Street.

The visitors looked to have set Durham a tricky target after ending their innings on 262-5, largely thanks to an unbeaten 113 from opener Neil Johnson.

The size of the task did not faze Durham however, who scorched to victory with 9.4 overs to spare. Martin Love and Paul Collingwood both hit half-centuries but it was Peng who took the plaudits for his 119.

Graeme Hick made hay in the sunshine as he smashed a 113-ball 155 to help Worcestershire to an emphatic 267-run victory over Hertfordshire.

At Blackpool, Jamie Haynes hit an unbeaten 59 as Lancashire had little trouble overcoming the Warwickshire Cricket Board.

Roses rivals Yorkshire did not have things all their own way against Bedfordshire but Darren Lehmann's 88 spared any blushes.

Simon Kellett (67) and skipper Ajaz Akhtar (78) shared a 121-run partnership as Cambridgeshire gave Somerset a scare but eventually fell short.

Chris Adams hit 89 as Sussex beat Cornwall and Essex proved too strong for Berkshire at Reading.

Warwickshire brushed aside the Kent Board and Northamptonshire avoided a potential banana skin in the form of their own Board side, as did Surrey.

Holders Gloucestershire ensured their progress with a comfortable 95-run win over the Sussex County Board. Kent, Nottinghamshire and Leicestershire were the other teams to go through with victories over Cumberland, Suffolk and Wales respectively.

**Herefordshire** – R1 lost to Sussex CB by 6 runs

HEREFORDSHIRE go in search of another county scalp as they make the short trip to face Worcestershire in the Cheltenham & Gloucester Trophy fourth round.

The minor county grabbed the headlines in the last round as they disposed of Middlesex in astonishing fashion.

Despite being set a daunting target of 279, they set about their task in aggressive fashion and enjoyed a three-wicket win with Harshad Patel and Nathan Round particularly impressive.

Club secretary Peter Sykes is confident of reproducing the triumph and said: "It's a marvellous draw for us against a neighbouring county.

"A lot of our lads have played for Worcestershire in the past and some of them will have a bit to prove.

"If you'd asked me a fortnight ago if we'd have more chance of beating Middlesex or Worcestershire, I'd have said Worcestershire but that isn't to say we will win.

"A lot of our committee are members at Worcester so we know their strengths and weaknesses but exploiting that is another matter." Worcestershire will be keen to repeat the emphatic performance they produced in beating Hertfordshire in round two, but director of cricket Tom Moody knows nothing can be taken for granted.

"I view it as a dangerous game. They must have a decent side because you don't chase 270-odd against a county side and overhaul it very often."

SOMERSET are boosted by the availability of their England stars as Glamorgan make the trip to Taunton in the Cheltenham & Gloucester Trophy.

Marcus Trescothick is back in county colours to open the batting, while Andy Caddick will take the new ball responsibilities with a quarter-final tie on the horizon.

Jamie Cox's side have not enjoyed the best of seasons so far, but in front of their home faithful will hope to take another crucial step towards a Lord's final.

Chief executive Peter Anderson said: "This represents a chance for us to do something this season and we'll be stronger with Caddick and Trescothick included.

"We haven't been doing too well at home this season and

the members are a bit disappointed so there will be a bit of pressure on the lads."

Glamorgan enjoyed victory against county opposition in round three with Derbyshire the victims, but they will again have to perform to their best to advance in the competition.

Overseas star Jimmy Maher and former England international Matthew Maynard are capable of dominating if given the chance but they must first cope with the challenge posed by Caddick.

Chief executive Mike Fatkin said: "They are a decent side and they'll be difficult to beat.

"We'd have rather been at home but one-day cricket is unpredictable and we've got a good chance."

YORKSHIRE tackle championship rivals Surrey in a titanic Cheltenham & Gloucester Trophy fourth-round clash.

The eyes of the nation will once again be on Headingley as two of the county scene's heavyweights battle it out for one quarter-final place.

The stakes for both star-studded sides are high, and with two championship encounters still to follow this season, tension is bound to be high during the televised clash.

Both teams go into the game in tremendous form with both full of international players.

Yorkshire coach Arnie Sidebottom said: "Of course it is going to be a big match. Both sides will want to get through so it is going to be really difficult. But games like this are

what we want." Surrey are bolstered by the return of Saqlain Mushtaq following his international commitments with Pakistan and will be high on confidence after reaching the final of the season's other one-day cup competition.

Coach Alan Butcher said: "There is going to be some tension between the two sides because of the championship situation.

"Our record in the competition isn't as good as we'd like and hopefully we can improve that. Yorkshire will be trying to secure a psychological edge over us with our two championship games still to come, which of course are going to be extremely vital."

CRICKET manager Clive Rice is hoping to include Usman Afzaal in the Nottinghamshire side to face Leicestershire in the Cheltenham & Gloucester Trophy fourth round tie at Trent Bridge.

"I don't know what is happening with the England players," Rice said. "Usman has won a few games for us this year, so obviously we want him in the team."

Nottinghamshire have already tasted victory over their Midlands rivals this season - an eight-wicket win in the Benson & Hedges Cup in April - but Rice is not expecting an easy ride.

He said: "We beat Leicestershire in the B&H but they won in the one-day league. They are a good one-day side. As long as the guys go out there and give their all, that is all I can ask for." Leicestershire captain Vince Wells reckons

Nottinghamshire's top-order is formidable, regardless of whether Afzaal plays.

"They are a very dangerous batting side," he said. "Greg Blewett is a great player, and Paul Johnson has shown how good he is over the years. These guys can actually win games on their own." The Foxes are not short of batting talent themselves, as their opponents in the previous round, the Wales Minor Counties, will testify.

Leicestershire plundered a daunting 332-4 from their 50 overs in Swansea, a performance which had Wells looking ahead further than the fourth round.

He added: "We are happy with our one-day game and know that if we play to our potential we should be winning trophies."

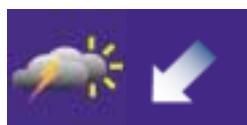

## THE DUCKWORTH/LEWIS SYSTEM

All Cheltenham & Gloucester Trophy matches have a reserve day, but if play is still lost to the weather the Duckworth Lewis system can be used to reset targets. The system is based on what percentage of its resources (overs and wickets) a team have left.

With 50 overs left and 10 wickets remaining, a team has 100 per cent of its resources left. The table shows the percentage of resources at other stages in the innings.

The procedure for working out targets is as follows:

- 1) For each innings: Use the table to calculate the resource percentage lost by the interruption and therefore calculate the resource percentage still available.
- 2) If team 2 have less resources available than team 1, calculate the ratio of the resources available to both teams. Team 2's revised target is obtained by scaling down team 1's score by this ratio.
- 3) If team 2 have more resources available than team 1, calculate the amount by which team 2's resources exceeds team 1's. Work this out as a percentage of 225 (the average 50-over score in ECB matches and one-day internationals). This gives the extra runs to add to team 1's score to give team 2's target.

## PLAYING CONDITIONS

- One innings per side of up to 50 overs. A maximum of 10 overs per bowler.
- Scheduled hours of play 11am to 6.45pm. Each innings scheduled to last a maximum three hours and 45 minutes. There will normally be two sessions of play of three hours and 30 minutes each, with an interval from 2.30pm to 3.25pm. The interval will be reduced if necessary.
- Two drinks intervals per innings, but these can be cancelled to make up time lost to interruptions.
- The fielding side can be penalised for slow over rates by the addition of runs to the batting side's total.
- For the first 15 overs a minimum of seven fielders plus the bowler and wicket-keeper must be inside the fielding circle as the ball is bowled. For the rest of the innings a minimum of four fielders plus the bowler and wicket-keeper must be inside the circle. The restrictions are lifted earlier when the number of overs is reduced.
- In the event of a tie, the team losing fewer wickets will win. If the sides are still level, the higher score after 15 overs will win.
- In rounds one and two, run rate may be used to set a revised target after a suspension of play. From round three onwards, the Duckworth Lewis system will be used.
