nglish cricket's premier one-day knockout competition this season has a new look - and a new sponsor.

The Cheltenham & Gloucester Trophy offers a chance of glory to 56 teams, from the first class counties down to the minor counties and the county board sides.

The international contribution from Scotland, Ireland, Holland and Denmark will be missing from the 2001 competition as those nations challenge for the ICC Trophy, but they will be back in contention later in the summer when the first two rounds of the 2002 competition will be played.

Cheltenham & Gloucester, the financial services company, has agreed to sponsor the tournament for three years.

"C&G is delighted to be the new sponsor of one of British cricket's most prestigious trophies," said the company's managing director, Roger Burden.

"We have a long-standing association with the game, sponsoring the popular Cheltenham Cricket Festival as well as many grass roots clubs and events. This new association is a reinforcement of our commitment to cricket at all levels

The clash of the round at the first stage is the meeting of

minor counties rivals Lincolnshire and Suffolk, at Sleaford's picture postcard ground.

May 1st

Mark Fell's Lincs finished as runners-up in last season's Minor Counties Eastern Division, one place ahead of Suffolk.

Fell said: "We have a very positive approach to every match. It's very important to win because Notts at home in the third round would be a big money-spinner for the county?

Derbyshire CB are out to create as big a stir in the 2001 Cheltenham & Gloucester Trophy as they did last season. Defeat against the full Derbyshire side finally ended the club cricketers' run after victory against Gloucestershire CB

Derbyshire CB development manager Colin Davies knows his side could cause an upset at Wiltshire. He said: "We had a good run last year and created an awful lot of local interest when we played Derbyshire.

"We go for a development squad with one or two more experienced players. We're quietly confident and think we've got a bit of a chance."




