Waqar aims to keep winning

Pakistan travel to Headingley to face England itching for some action after Saturday's clash with Australia at the Riverside was completely washed out.

Waqar Younis' side may already have qualified for the NatWest Series final but they will feel that the Durham rain robbed them of a chance to weigh up their Lord's opponents before next week's showpiece.

Mist and heavy drizzle prevented play from getting underway at the scheduled start time and persistent rain meant that the inevitable decision to abandon was made shortly after 2pm.

Pakistan of course have another chance to take a look at the Aussies before the final when they meet Steve Waugh's side at Trent Bridge on Tuesday but first must focus their attention on beating England.

England are already eliminated from the competition but have played some positive cricket along the way and Younis has warned his side against complacency, urging them to produce more of the form that saw them beat the hosts at Lord's on Tuesday.

He said: "I was very happy with the run-outs and the fielding - it was magic. Our guys played really well, especially Yousuf Youhana and Younis Khan." England will head to Leeds feeling they have one or two points to prove in their final two games of the tournament. They may have lost to Pakistan and Australia twice but they have the opportunity to at least gain some revenge with games to come against both sides.

Big crowds are already guaranteed for Headingley and Thursday's clash with Australia at The Oval and Alec Stewart's side will have no intention of disappointing them.

Despite their defeats, the hosts have played some good cricket with several youngsters, notably Marcus Trescothick and Owais Shah, taking the chance to shine. With the next World Cup now on the horizon, there remains plenty for them to play for - weather permitting!

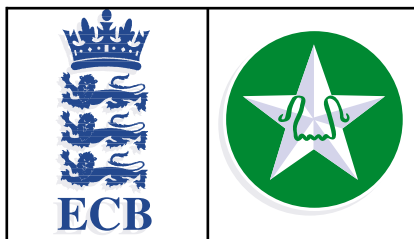

| <p>ENGLAND coach Duncan Fletcher will stick with his young guns as he looks to bring some of his great success from the Test arena into one-day cricket.</p> <p>The host nation's four defeats in the NatWest Series have been brightened by the performances of Marcus Trescothick, Owais Shah and Ben Hollisioake and Fletcher believes they have much more to offer England.</p> <p>Trescothick almost guided England to victory in their last meeting with Pakistan on Tuesday with a brilliant century and Fletcher is looking forward to a bright future with the big Somerset opener and the side's recent recruits on board.</p> <p>Fletcher said: "We have to identify a certain amount of players now that we believe in and are going to stick with - that's the only way we're going to get out of our losing run."</p> <p>"We can't suddenly bring guys in, give them a couple of games and then hurl them out because that's going to cause real problems and knock the confidence out of team and each individual player if he comes in and out in a situation like this." Key Players

Ben Hollisioake

The Surrey all-rounder has re-emerged after almost four years out of the England side with some excellent performances with bat and ball in the NatWest Series. He may have been dismissed - unluckily - for ducks in both his last two innings but his unbeaten 37 against Australia at Bristol and his superb bowling spell at Old Trafford have marked him out as a player to be persevered with.

Rashid Latif

The former Pakistan captain has returned to international fold on this tour and his performances with both bat and gloves in the NatWest Series have proved the decision to reinstate him was a wise one. He cracked 66 against Australia at Cardiff, and although it wore him out so much he couldn't keep wicket in that game, he returned behind the stumps to play a key role against England at Lord's.

How It Works

○ All matches will consist of one innings per side and each innings will be limited to 50 overs. A minimum of 25 overs per team shall constitute a match.

○ Matches shall be of one day's scheduled duration with the exception of the final, for which a reserve day has been allocated in case of weather interruption.

○ In matches without a reserve day there is provision for up to 60 minutes of extra official playing time in day matches and up to 30 minutes in floodlit matches to make up for time lost.

○ Play is scheduled to start at 10.45am with an interval of 45 minutes at 2.15pm and close of play at 6.30pm.

○ At floodlit matches play is scheduled to start at 2.30pm with an interval of 45 minutes at 6pm and close of play at 10.15pm.

○ Two drinks intervals, each one hour and 10 minutes apart, are permitted for each innings.

○ Where play is delayed or interrupted the umpires will reduce the length of the interval between innings. If up to 60 minutes are lost the interval will be reduced to 30 minutes. If between 60 and 120 minutes are lost the interval will be reduced to 20 minutes. If more than 120 minutes are lost the interval will be reduced to 10 minutes.

○ In games without a reserve day there is provision for up to 60 minutes of extra playing time for day matches and 30 minutes for floodlit matches.

○ If the innings of the team batting first is completed prior to the scheduled time for the interval, the interval shall take place immediately and the innings of the team batting second will commence correspondingly earlier.

○ For the first 15 overs only two fieldsmen are permitted to be outside the field restriction marking at the instant of delivery. This restriction will be lifted earlier in circumstances where the number of overs is reduced.

○ No bowler shall bowl more than 10 overs in an innings. In a delayed or interrupted match where the overs are reduced no bowler may bowl more than one-fifth of the total overs allowed.

○ A no ball will be called for short-pitched bowling. The penalty will be one run plus any runs scored.

○ Umpires have been instructed to apply a very strict and consistent interpretation in calling wides. The penalty will be one run plus any runs scored.

○ In line with the ICC Code of Conduct, fines may be imposed for slow over rates.

○ Teams will play each other three times in the group stage and score two points for a win and one point for a tie or no result.

○ If the scores in a match are level the result shall be a tie and no account shall be taken of the number of wickets that have fallen.

○ The top two teams in the group will contest the final. In the event of teams finishing on equal points the right to play in the final will be decided according to:

The most wins in the group matches;

The team that won the most matches between the tied sides;

The team with the higher run rate;

The team that has taken the higher number of wickets per balls;

In the event that teams are still level they will draw lots.

The Duckworth Lewis System

If matches are rain-affected the Duckworth Lewis system is used to reset targets. The system is based on what percentage of its resources (overs and wickets) a team have left. With 50 overs left and 10 wickets remaining, a team has 100 per cent of its resources left. The table shows the percentage of resources at other stages in the innings.

The procedure for working out targets is as follows:

1) For each innings: Use the table to calculate the resource percentage lost by the interruption and therefore calculate the resource percentage still available.

2) If team 2 have less resources available than team 1, calculate the ratio of the resources available to both teams. Team 2's revised target is obtained by scaling down team 1's score by this ratio.

3) If team 2 have more resources available than team 1, calculate the amount by which team 2's resources exceeds team 1's.

Work this out as a percentage of 225 (the average 50-over score in ECB matches and one-day internationals). This gives the extra runs to add to team score to give team 2's target.
