Holders Somerset prepare for tough test

Cheltenham & Gloucester Trophy holders Somerset have a home draw against Worcestershire as the competition reaches the quarter-final stage.

After overcoming Hampshire in the fourth round largely thanks to a magnificent century from Marcus Trescothick, the West Country side will be confident of progressing to the last four but victory at Taunton is far from certain.

Worcestershire have performed well in one-day cricket so far this season and in Graeme Hick, Vikram Solanki and Ben Smith, they possess plenty of quality in the middle order and Australian all-rounder Andy Bichel is also a major threat.

Kent lost to Somerset in the last eight in 2001 but have a chance to go at least one step further this year when they host Gloucestershire at Canterbury.

David Fulton skippered the side to a 128-run win against Warwickshire in the last round after they posted a massive total of 328 for nine off 50 overs.

A similar batting display would cause Gloucestershire all sorts of problems but in Craig Spearman the visitors have a player capable of winning a game on his own.

Essex skipper Nasser Hussain seeks to maintain his superb form in the competition this year when his team face Yorkshire. Hussain has amassed 179 runs in his two innings and more of the same could spell the end for Darren Lehmann's side who have struggled to produce their best during the current campaign.

The final game of four, sees Sussex host Surrey at Hove and the visitors will hope a number of their international stars can shine to lead them into the semi-finals.

Both teams lost in the fourth round last year but victory in this game gives them real hope of reaching the final at Lord's.

Brown brilliance sees Surrey through

Surrey and Glamorgan produced one of the most amazing one-day matches in history as records were constantly broken at The AMP Oval.

A magnificent innings by Surrey's Alistair Brown, who smashed a one-day world record 268 off just 160 balls, helped his side to an incredible total of 438 for five from 50 overs.

However, his amazing knock was not the end of the drama as Glamorgan then produced one of the gutsiest run-chases in the history of limited overs cricket.

Needing to score at almost nine an over, Glamorgan came within a whisker of a sensational win thanks to centuries from Robert Croft and David Hemp, plus a late flurry from Darren Thomas.

But in the end they had to settle for second-best as they lost by nine runs in a game which produced 867 runs - yet another record - including 87 fours and 28 sixes.

Nasser Hussain led from the front as Essex comfortably disposed of Lancashire by nine wickets at Chelmsford.

After dismissing the visitors for 166, Hussain struck a fluent 83 not out from 96 balls to see his side home.

Craig Spearman was another centurion as Gloucestershire reached their victory target of 180 after just 26 overs against Durham.

His unbeaten 104 off 77 balls included 18 boundaries.

Kent thrashed Warwickshire mainly thanks to a century from James Hockley while Sussex defeated last year's beaten finalists Leicestershire with Richard Montgomerie scoring a rapid ton.

Cheltenham & Gloucester Trophy holders Somerset reached their target of 263 with over four overs to spare against Hampshire at Taunton, Marcus Trescothick leading the way with a powerful 133 off 115 balls.

Graeme Hick and Vikram Solanki both reached three figures as Worcestershire tormented Nottinghamshire's bowlers at Trent Bridge while Yorkshire's total of 303 for three proved beyond Northamptonshire who were dismissed for 254 after 48.2 overs at Northampton.

The Duckworth/Lewis system

All Cheltenham & Gloucester Trophy matches have a reserve day, but if play is still lost to the weather the Duckworth Lewis system can be used to reset targets. The system is based on what percentage of its resources (overs and wickets) a team have left.

With 50 overs left and 10 wickets remaining, a team has 100 per cent of its resources left. The table shows the percentage of resources at other stages in the innings.

The procedure for working out targets is as follows:

- 1) For each innings: Use the table to calculate the resource percentage lost by the interruption and therefore calculate the resource percentage still available.
- 2) If team 2 have less resources available than team 1, calculate the ratio of the resources available to both teams. Team 2's revised target is obtained by scaling down team 1's score by this ratio.
- 3) If team 2 have more resources available than team 1, calculate the amount by which team 2's resources exceeds team 1's. Work this out as a percentage of 225 (the average 50-over score in ECB matches and one-day internationals). This gives the extra runs to add to team 1's score to give team 2's target.

Playing conditions

- One innings per side of up to 50 overs. A maximum of 10 overs per bowler.
- Scheduled hours of play 11am to 6.45pm. Each innings scheduled to last a maximum three hours and 45 minutes. There will normally be two sessions of play of three hours and 30 minutes each, with an interval from 2.30pm to 3.25pm. The interval will be reduced if necessary.
- Two drinks intervals per innings, but these can be cancelled to make up time lost to interruptions.
- The fielding side can be penalised for slow over rates by the addition of runs to the batting side's total.
- For the first 15 overs a minimum of seven fielders plus the bowler and wicket-keeper must be inside the fielding circle as the ball is bowled. For the rest of the innings a minimum of four fielders plus the bowler and wicket-keeper must be inside the circle. The restrictions are lifted earlier when the number of overs is reduced.
- In the event of a tie, the team losing fewer wickets will win. If the sides are still level, the higher score after 15 overs will win.
- In rounds one and two, run rate may be used to set a revised target after a suspension of play. From round three onwards, the Duckworth Lewis system will be used.
