Somerset start their defence at seaside

Somerset begin their defence of the Cheltenham & Gloucester Trophy by the sea as they travel north to Scarborough.

The west country side's last game in this competition came in front of a packed house at Lord's last autumn but this year's campaign will begin in rather more sedate surroundings as they tackle a Yorkshire Cricket Board XI.

Scarborough is not unused to the big occasion itself however, it being the venue where Yorkshire clinched a long-awaited County Championship success last year.

This time it will provide a team of amateurs pulled together from the strong leagues in Yorkshire with a chance to pit their wits against first-class opposition.

The Yorkshire Board XI are one of 14 amateur sides in the third round after the first two rounds were played at the tail end of last season.

Each will hope to make home advantage count as they look to produce upsets to rank alongside Herefordshire's stunning victory over Middlesex last season.

Herefordshire will not be repeating any of their own heroics this year after their second-round loss to fellow minor county Suffolk, but there are plenty of ties of interest.

Not least is the clash between Scotland and Surrey at Edinburgh, which could be a more regular fixture next season.

The Scots are set to play in the National League Second Division from next year as they look to accelerate development of the game in the country.

A C&G Trophy tie against Surrey may not make up for the disappointment of missing out on the World Cup, but the game will be watched with interest at Lord's as well as the Oval.

There are two all first-class ties with Lancashire taking on Derbyshire at Old Trafford and Middlesex travelling to Chelmsford to face Essex.

The sides have been paired together after finishing in the bottom four of last season's National League.

Herefordshire miss chance to repeat shock

The second round of the tournament took place less than a fortnight after Somerset's victory over Leicestershire at Lord's on September 1.

And the dream for the 28 sides who had qualified was a plum tie with one of the big guns, who have now entered the fray.

Herefordshire proved what could be done last year in beating the might of Middlesex, but they failed to set up the chance of claiming another county scalp.

Facing Suffolk at Bury St Edmonds, Herefordshire were skittled out for just 151 runs chasing 255 to win.

South African David Callaghan took three for 28 and was the pick of a solid five-pronged Suffolk attack that secured a third-round tie at home to Northamptonshire.

Ireland's Andre Botha, in only his second appearance, turned in a match-winning performance against Hampshire CB, scoring 75 and taking three for 30 in the Emerald Isle's 32-run win.

Devon beat Bedfordshire by three wickets, a win due largely to 88 from their former Gloucestershire batsman Bobby Dawson while West Indian Phil Simmons inspired Wales to a narrow three-run victory over Sussex CB.

Simmons hit 51 and then took three for 34 to book a third-round tie at home to Durham.

Yorkshire CB bowler Steve Foster claimed one of two five-wicket hauls in the round as Gloucestershire CB made just 189 and lost by four wickets.

Matthew Bulbeck was the other (5-18) as Norfolk won through a rain-affected match with Somerset CB.

Jim Troughton, now with the senior Warwickshire side, had scored a sensational century for the Cricket Board in the first round and followed up with a

solid 51 against Cambridgeshire.

Bhavin Joshi then took three wickets in two overs to seal a comfortable 75-run win and seal a home tie against Leicestershire.

Cornwall face Worcestershire after Ben Price (74) and Steve Pope (59) batted them to victory over Cheshire, while Kent CB progressed past their Leicestershire counterparts on the back of an inspired bowling spell from Ryan Minter.

Coming on second change he took six for eight in seven overs to seal a 189-run win.

Lincolnshire cruised to victory over Surrey CB on the back of a strong all-round bowling performance while Staffordshire romped to a seven-wicket victory over Northumberland, with former Windies all-rounder Ottis Gibson scoring an unbeaten 102.

Scotland were too strong for Dorset and completed a 10-wicket victory in just 15.5 overs while Shropshire booked a tie with erstwhile one-day kings Gloucestershire with a win over Oxfordshire.

The Duckworth/Lewis system

All Cheltenham & Gloucester Trophy matches have a reserve day, but if play is lost to the weather the Duckworth Lewis system can be used to reset targets. The system is based on what percentage of its resources (overs and wickets) a team have left.

With 50 overs left and 10 wickets remaining, a team has 100 per cent of its resources left. The table shows the percentage of resources at other stages in the innings.

The procedure for working out targets is as follows:

- 1) For each innings: Use the table to calculate the resource percentage lost by the interruption and therefore calculate the resource percentage still available.
- 2) If team 2 have less resources available than team 1, calculate the ratio of the resources available to both teams. Team 2's revised target is obtained by scaling down team 1's score by this ratio.
- 3) If team 2 have more resources available than team 1, calculate the amount by which team 2's resources exceeds team 1's. Work this out as a percentage of 225 (the average 50-over score in ECB matches and one-day internationals). This gives the extra runs to add to team 1's score to give team 2's target.

Playing conditions

- One innings per side of up to 50 overs. A maximum of 10 overs per bowler.
- Scheduled hours of play 11am to 6.45pm. Each innings scheduled to last a maximum three hours and 45 minutes. There will normally be two sessions of play of three hours and 30 minutes each, with an interval from 2.30pm to 3.25pm. The interval will be reduced if necessary.
- Two drinks intervals per innings, but these can be cancelled to make up time lost to interruptions.
- The fielding side can be penalised for slow over rates by the addition of runs to the batting side's total.
- For the first 15 overs a minimum of seven fielders plus the bowler and wicket-keeper must be inside the fielding circle as the ball is bowled. For the rest of the innings a minimum of four fielders plus the bowler and wicket-keeper must be inside the circle. The restrictions are lifted earlier when the number of overs is reduced.
- In the event of a tie, the team losing fewer wickets will win. If the sides are still level, the higher score after 15 overs will win.
- In rounds one and two, run rate may be used to set a revised target after a suspension of play. From round three onwards, the Duckworth Lewis system will be used.
