orcestershire's joy at reaching Lord's for the first time in nine years was heightened by the news that Andrew Hall will be available for the Cheltenham & Gloucester Trophy final.

The all-rounder, whose doublewicket maiden last over against Lancashire secured an unlikely triumph, has been cleared to play by the South African management despite his involvement with the Test squad.

"It will be great for us to have him back on board - and hopefully he plays as well as he did in the semi," said Worcestershire director of cricket Tom Moody.

"The great thing about Hally was that it was not only me and the club wanting him to play against Lancashire. He made it clear he really wanted to play in that match.

"It just shows the attitude of the guy - and they are without question the type of guys you want in your side."

Hall said: "I've been lucky enough now to play there twice already this summer for my country and to be involved in a major county final as well will be special."

It is a different story for Gloucestershire, whose semi-final hero Shoaib Malik misses the game after his brief stint as locum overseas player ended.

The Pakistan all-rounder collected the man-of-the-match award for his composed 74 in a tense one-wicket victory over Derbyshire at Bristol, only to depart to accommodate lan Harvey's return.

Harvey has been on international duty with Australia during the one-day series trouncing of Bangladesh, although the Lord's showcase should be a less one-sided affair.

Malik and Hall star in thrillers



loucestershire reached their sixth Lord's final in five seasons with a tense one-wicket win over Derbyshire in the Cheltenham & Gloucester Trophy semi-final at Bristol.

The absence of all-rounder lan Harvey made little difference to Gloucestershire as his short-term replacement Shoaib Malik made a composed 74 to earn the man-ofthe-match award in his final match for the county.

Derbyshire's 219 - which was held together by Mohammad Kaif's 72 - appeared an under-par score but four wickets inside the first 15 overs of the reply brought hope for Derbyshire.

But Malik shared a 56-run stand with Alex Gidman for the fifth wicket and added a further 59 with captain Mark Alleyne, who caused some late panic by chipping to extra-cover moments before Jack Russell was adjudged caught behind, both off Lian Wharton.

Then Dominic Cork claimed two wickets in an over, leaving James Averis and Mike Smith to negotiate the three runs required from the final five overs which they managed to the jubilation of the home crowd.

There was another tense finale at New Road as Andrew Hall bowled a dramatic last over to snatch victory from the jaws of defeat and earn Worcestershire a six-run win over Lancashire.

Lancashire looked set for victory when they began the last over from Hall needing just seven runs for victory at 248 for six.

But the South African dismissed Warren Hegg and Peter Martin in Shoaib Malik the space of three balls while John Wood was run out off the fifth as Lancashire failed to score off the final over, leaving Hall with four for 36.

The result was rough on opener Mal Love, who scored his first limited-overs century for Lancashire and finished unbeaten on 116 after helping his side recover from the dismissals of Stuart Law, Carl Hooper and Andrew Flintoff.

Worcestershire's total of 254 for five had been built around a commanding innings of 97 from Graeme Hick, who shared in a second-wicket stand of 155 in 32 overs with Anurag Singh (63).





The Duckworth/Lewis system

All Cheltenham & Gloucester Trophy matches have a reserve day, but if play is still lost to the weather the Duckworth Lewis system can be used to reset targets. The system is based on what percentage of its resources (overs and wickets) a team have left.

With 50 overs left and 10 wickets remaining, a team has 100 per cent of its resources left. The table shows the percentage of resources at other stages in the innings.

The procedure for working out targets is as follows:



For each innings: Use the table to calculate the resource percentage lost by the interruption and therefore calculate the resource percentage still available.



If team 2 have less resources available than team 1, calculate the ratio of the resources available to both teams. Team 2's revised target is obtained by scaling down team 1's score by this ratio.



3) If team 2 have more resources available than team 1, calculate the amount by which team 2's resources exceeds team 1's. Work this out as a percentage of 235 (the average 50-over score in ECB matches and one-day internationals). This gives the extra runs to add to team 1's score to give team 2's target.

Playing conditions

- One innings per side of up to 50 overs. A maximum of 10 overs
- Scheduled hours of play 11am to 6.45pm. Each innings scheduled to last a maximum three hours and 45 minutes. There will normally be two sessions of play of three hours and 30 minutes each, with an interval from 2.30pm to 3.25pm. The interval will be reduced if necessary.
- Two drinks intervals per innings, but these can be cancelled to make up time lost to interruptions.
- The fielding side can be penalised for slow over rates by the addition of runs to the batting side's total.
- For the first 15 overs a minimum of seven fielders plus the bowler and wicket-keeper must be inside the fielding circle as the ball is bowled. For the rest of the innings a minimum of four fielders plus the bowler and wicket-keeper must be inside the circle. The restrictions are lifted earlier when the number of overs is reduced.
- In the event of a tie, the team losing fewer wickets will win.

 If the sides are still level, the higher score after 15 overs will win.
- In rounds one and two, run rate may be used to set a revised target after a suspension of play. From round three onwards, the Duckworth Lewis system will be used.
