

Surrey on the road again

Surrey must again do it the hard way if they are to reach the last four of the Cheltenham & Gloucester Trophy after being drawn away from home once again.

Adam Hollioake's men - who were drawn away in both the quarter-finals and semi-finals last year - have already had to make trips to Staffordshire and Leicestershire in this year's competition and face a trip to Derbyshire in the quarter-finals.

Surrey's star-packed side will start as firm favourites at Derby but will be wary of an upset after Derbyshire surprisingly saw off Glamorgan at Cardiff in the last round.

Derbyshire batsman Chris Bassano is in red-hot form after making centuries in the previous two rounds against Kent Cricket Board (101) and Glamorgan (121).

In the other quarter-finals, 2001 finalists Leicestershire's reward for their victory against Nottinghamshire is another home draw against Worcestershire.

The clash will bring a return to Grace Road for Ben Smith, who left the Foxes for their Midlands rivals at the end of the 2001 season.

Lancashire have won the competition a record six times and look a good bet to mount a strong challenge once again after being drawn at home to Middlesex.

There will be a repeat of the 2000 final at Edgbaston as Warwickshire face Gloucestershire looking to gain revenge for their 22-run defeat on the Duckworth-Lewis method three years ago.

It will be the second meeting between the two teams in the space of four days following their National League clash at Gloucester.

C & G Fourth Round Review

Holdings crash out as Hayward impresses

Yorkshire's defence of the Cheltenham & Gloucester Trophy ended in the fourth round after a Nantie Hayward-inspired Worcestershire bowled them out for 177 at New Road.

David Leatherdale top-scored for Worcestershire against his home county with 80 while Vikram Solanki chipped in with 60 as the home side posted 244 for eight.

South African paceman Hayward had been an injury doubt but dispelled any fitness concerns by taking five for 49 as the holders fell 67 runs short of their target despite a useful 47 from Michael Vaughan.

Vaughan's fellow England international Graham Thorpe proved he has returned to something like his best form as Surrey edged past Somerset at Taunton.

Thorpe hammered 102 off 103 deliveries in the visitors' innings of 281 for six before last year's runners-up were restricted to 275.

Essex must have known it was not to be their day at Edgbaston when Nasser Hussain was run out first ball and fellow opener Will Jefferson also went without scoring.

They recovered to make 256 for five but Dougie Brown (108) made his maiden limited-overs hundred and Ashley Giles hit 71 as Warwickshire claimed a three-wicket victory.

James Anderson (three for 14) continued the form that has seen him burst onto the

international scene as Lancashire made short work of Durham's batting line-up, bowling out their hosts for 86 at the Riverside after posting 229 for nine.

Paul Weekes (73) and Andrew Strauss (75) put on 139 for the first wicket to help Middlesex to a match-winning total of 258 for eight against Sussex. The result was rough on Sussex seamer James Kirtley who took five for 41 and then hit an unbeaten 30 but still ended up a loser as his side fell 17 runs short.

Nottinghamshire were beaten by Leicestershire in the all-Midlands affair after crumbling to 159 all out in reply to the Foxes' 258 for nine, while Chris Bassano hammered 121 off 100 balls to lead Derbyshire to a seven-wicket victory over Glamorgan.

Gloucestershire chalked up a five-wicket win over Kent with 4.2 overs to spare at Canterbury after bowling out the home side for 194.

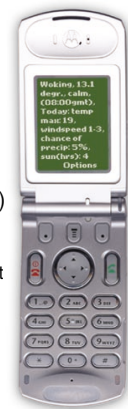

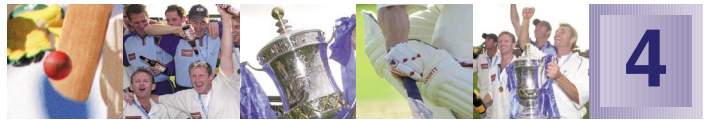

The Duckworth/Lewis system

All Cheltenham & Gloucester Trophy matches have a reserve day, but if play is still lost to the weather the Duckworth Lewis system can be used to reset targets. The system is based on what percentage of its resources (overs and wickets) a team have left.

With 50 overs left and 10 wickets remaining, a team has 100 per cent of its resources left. The table shows the percentage of resources at other stages in the innings.

The procedure for working out targets is as follows:

- 1** For each innings: Use the table to calculate the resource percentage lost by the interruption and therefore calculate the resource percentage still available.
- 2** If team 2 have less resources available than team 1, calculate the ratio of the resources available to both teams. Team 2's revised target is obtained by scaling down team 1's score by this ratio.
- 3** If team 2 have more resources available than team 1, calculate the amount by which team 2's resources exceeds team 1's. Work this out as a percentage of 225 (the average 50-over score in ECB matches and one-day internationals). This gives the extra runs to add to team 1's score to give team 2's target.

Playing conditions

- One innings per side of up to 50 overs. A maximum of 10 overs per bowler.
- Scheduled hours of play 11am to 6.45pm. Each innings scheduled to last a maximum three hours and 45 minutes. There will normally be two sessions of play of three hours and 30 minutes each, with an interval from 2.30pm to 3.25pm. The interval will be reduced if necessary.
- Two drinks intervals per innings, but these can be cancelled to make up time lost to interruptions.
- The fielding side can be penalised for slow over rates by the addition of runs to the batting side's total.
- For the first 15 overs a minimum of seven fielders plus the bowler and wicket-keeper must be inside the fielding circle as the ball is bowled. For the rest of the innings a minimum of four fielders plus the bowler and wicket-keeper must be inside the circle. The restrictions are lifted earlier when the number of overs is reduced.
- In the event of a tie, the team losing fewer wickets will win. If the sides are still level, the higher score after 15 overs will win.
- In rounds one and two, run rate may be used to set a revised target after a suspension of play. From round three onwards, the Duckworth Lewis system will be used.
