

FTCT 3 DAYS COMPETITION ELIGIBILITY CHECKLIST

1. Nationality Qualifications:

Players must meet one or more of the central eligibility criteria:

- 1.1) A national of the country (as defined by the country) or
- 1.2) Born in the country or
- 1.3) Resident in the country for at least 183 days in each of the previous 7 years

2. Development Criteria:

Players must also meet one or more of the development criteria:

- 2.1) Played 50% of games in national competition in any 3 of the 5 preceding years or
- 2.2) Spent a cumulative total of 100 days over the preceding 5 years doing cricket work or
- 2.3) Played representative cricket for that country in the past or
- 2.4) Done enough to convince ACC that he has genuine commitment to development of cricket in that country.

Countries may also play an unlimited number of players who qualify under Nationality Criteria and meet one or more of the Development Criteria.

3. Deemed Nationals:

Countries may also play a maximum of two 'deemed nationals'. These are players who do not qualify under the above core criteria, but who have resided in the country for a minimum of 183 days in each of the previous 4 years and who meet the development criteria.

Evidence Required in support of team registrations

- For players who qualify under 1.1 or 1.2 but are not residents of the country, documentary evidence is required in the form of copy of passport and birth certificate, or confirmation letter from respective Home Office.
- For players who qualify under 1.3, documentary evidence is required in the form of: confirmation letter from president of club(s) represented, and letter from employer, copy of Passport showing relevant Visa.
- For players who qualify under Deemed National criteria documentary evidence is required in the form of: letter from president of club(s) represented, letter from employer, copy Passport showing relevant Visa.
